New metal equipment shed reinforcement	To be determined	4 to 6 people, drills, socket sets, wrenches, ladders	Winston Fayant 250 365-3527
Clean the cabins	As and when a crew can commit	2 to 4 per cabin	Jim McKay 250 365-6674
Install/repair trail signs and posts	Late September / Early October	2 or 3 with trucks and/or ATVs, cordless drills, spikes, lag screws, shovels, sledge hammer	Al Skakun 250 365-6544
Inspect all trails for danger trees and fall or mark for certified faller to remove	To be determined	ATV, faller, chainsaw, Danger tree assessor, notebook, flagging tape	Chris Campagnaro 250 359-2295
