Finally, I hope all club members will consider coming out to the Fall General Meeting (FGM) on November 14th to hear about club events and to provide input and recommendations. This year we are planning to dedicate a larger part of the general meeting to a Q&A with the club Executive and for discussion with the members.

Trails and Infrastructure Report

An early snowfall and significant winds in October resulted in numerous trees blocking access throughout the trail system. Volunteer crews have been very successful removing the downed trees and cutting brush to ensure access is ready for the track setters. A faller has been working throughout the trail system to remove a number of danger trees. Also, an excavator has upgraded the trail surface and removed brush and small trees on the Connector, Pine, and Huckleberry trails. Grass seeding of disturbed areas will be completed early next summer.



Construction of the Snowberry shelter is now complete after a few remaining minor works were carried out this summer. A group of volunteers has cleaned all the toilets and shelters and hauled in a good supply of firewood.

Fee Collections and Cabin Wardens

Castlegar Nordic Ski Club is a non-profit organization that relies on volunteers to provide an exceptional ski experience to our membership and guests. In order to do this, we require funds beyond our membership fees to support the costs associated with the running of our hill. Fee Collection is critical in meeting our costs and keeping our membership fees low. We are taking a different approach to this activity this year to ensure we



have coverage during peak times and that both trailhead entrances are covered. The shift is 10am to 2pm. If a member or guest volunteers for 4 days or more, they will receive a free ski pass for the following ski season. All volunteers will be trained on the position before their shift.

Our cabins are also a key part of the excellent skiing experience given to our membership and guests. Many volunteer hours are given to prepare the cabins for the upcoming season. Thank you to all that have come out this year and in the past. To ensure our cabins and outhouses are maintained throughout the season as well, we have adopted a cabin warden program. What this involves is keeping the cabin and outhouse clean and well stocked throughout the season. A kit is provided, and it is a fairly simple process. Two of our cabins have been "adopted" - Glenmerry and Snowberry - and we are looking for wardens for the remaining four cabins. For the most part, it is a once a week process. Wardens can be individuals, family groups, friend groups etc.

The Avenza Maps app is available for both iPhone and Android phones and uses your phone's built-in GPS to precisely track your location with a moving dot in real time! The app also provides a number of other features including the ability to zoom in or out on the map, drop and label placemarks, attach photos and record your track, distance and
